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Report on "Industrial Visit"

Introduction:-

The Industrial visit was organised by the Department of Fashion & Apparel Design for the Second year B.Sc. Students to a textile testing organization as part of the curriculum requirement. The visit aimed to provide practical exposure to the textile testing and help students understand the importance of textile testing to be done on apparels and garments. This experience helped bridge the gap between theoretical knowledge and real-time industrial practices.

Description: -

The visit was arranged and conducted by Mr.Jagadish, managing director of Bureau Veritas. Bureau Veritas is a global leader in laboratory testing, inspection, and certification (TIC) services, founded in 1828 and headquartered in Paris, France. It helps companies ensure their products, infrastructure, and processes meet safety, quality, and environmental standards, operating in sectors like textiles,garments, marine, buildings, and consumer products.The primary objectives of the visit were

- To understand the basic principles and processes of textile testing.
- To observe the testing procedure of hazardous chemicals and physical testing.
- To study in detail about organic and inorganic testing in chemical testing.
- To understand the role of testing in textile industry.

The Labs demonstrated a range of textile tests during visits, ensuring fabric durability and safety. They explained about test for

Technical outerwear: Moisture vapour transmission, air permeability, and waterproofing, thermal insulation.

Flammability: For apparel, sleepwear, furnishings using specialized testers after moisture control.

Colourfastness: Washing, light, perspiration, saliva via crocking and exposure methods.

Mechanical: Tensile strength (universal tester), abrasion (Martindale), tear strength (Elmendorf), pilling.

Chemical/toxicology: Formaldehyde, AZO dyes, lead, fiber composition (wool, cashmere, blends).

Physical: Dimensional stability (shrinkage), yarn analysis, seam strength.



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The facility holds ISO/IEC 17025:2005 accreditation for over 50 tests on textiles, toys, and plastics, aiding exports with REACH, Oeko-Tex, and GOTS certifications. Staff explain traceability via LIMS software for sample logging and report generation.

Feedback from students:

Fashion and textile students highlight the educational value of observing departments like textile testing, performance evaluation, and chemical analysis. Students appreciated demonstrations of precision in sample handling, advanced instruments for tensile strength and colorfastness, and emphasis on international standards such as ISO, REACH, and Oeko-Tex. The industrial visit to the textile testing unit was highly informative and beneficial for the second year B.Sc. Fashion and Apparel Design students. It provided hands-on exposure to real industrial practices and enriched their understanding of testing of apparels. The visit successfully met its objectives and contributed significantly to the students' academic and professional development. Valuable insights into rigorous testing and quality assurance processes that fashion products undergo before reaching the market. Reinforced the critical role in consumer safety.
